There is a charge for US Funds the US\$ is .98 to the Canadian \$ (i.e. bill is \$100 and you send US Funds then divide the amount by .98 (100/.98 = \$102.04 US to equal \$100 Canadian we reserve the right to change this rate should the US\$ increase or decrease). We charge 4% above the day of deposit rate. The tax due dale for this year is July 27, 2011. Penalty at the rate of 1.25% per month or fraction thereof is added to outstanding taxes on the 1st day of each month. Payments are to be made payable to TOWNSHIP OF LAKE OF THE WOODS.
